Today's Music

"The Lord Is My Light" is one of the enduring dramatic songs from the "golden age" of operatic church music that was popular in the early twentieth century. The song was written by Frances Allitsen, whose real name was Mary Bumpus (1848-1912). She grew up in a small town in England and went against her parents' wishes by becoming a musician, eventually moving to London. She started out pursuing singing, but lost her voice and turned to composing. This is her most performed composition, and is based on Psalm 27.

"Sweet Beulah Land" is a popular Southern Gospel song written by Squire Parsons. Parsons is a native of West Virginia and was a band director before becoming part of the Kingsmen quartet in 1975. He eventually went into solo ministry and is a Dove award winner. This song talks about the beauty and serenity of heaven as "sweet Beulah land," where there is no more hardship and pain. "Beulah" is a reference to Is. 62.4, and describes the New Jerusalem.
