Today's Music

Today's special music will be sung by a men's ensemble, but all of the music has been arranged for Male Quartet. Tracing quartet history would take more time than we have here, but the male quartet has a significant place in American music history, as it arose out of a combination of forces, including Spirituals, minstrel shows, and hymnody. Whether in church services, revivals, barbershops, or parlors, it was a popular diversion for men to sing together in close harmony, beginning in the 19th century.

In the early-mid 20th century "singing schools" were popular, and various publishing companies used the schools (and quartets) to increase music sales. One such company was the Rodeheaver Publishing Company, and the song "By and By" comes from such a book. Charles Gabriel (1856-1932) is the author of both words and music, though he used the pseudonym "Charlotte Homer" for the words of this song (a common practice). He grew up as an active boy in the

local Presbyterian Church in Wilton, Iowa and is said to have written over 7000 songs in his lifetime, including "His Eye Is On The Sparrow." The subject matter of these songs in general are personal in nature (like the Psalms of Lament) and always express faith that God is with us in the darkest of times
