Introduction

Opening Statement

Mark Smith has been called by God to become a Commissioned Lay Pastor in this congregation and that call has been confirmed through study and examination by the Presbytery of the New Covenant. Therefore it is right for us to proceed to ordain him to his call and install him in the ministry that God has given to him.

Constitutional Questions

Mark, since you desire to be commissioned as a Lay Pastor I would ask you now to make answer to these questions from the Constitution of the Presbyterian Church USA.

Do you trust in Jesus Christ your Savior, acknowledge him Lord of all and Head of the Church, and through him believe in one God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit?

Do you accept the Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments to be, by the Holy Spirit, the unique and authoritative witness to Jesus Christ in the Church universal, and God's Word to you?

Do you sincerely receive and adopt the essential tenets of the Reformed faith as expressed in the confessions of our church as authentic and reliable expositions of what Scripture leads us to believe and do, and will you be instructed and led by those confessions as you lead the people of God?

Will you fulfill your office in obedience to Jesus Christ, under the authority of Scripture, and be continually guided by our confessions?

Will you be governed by our church's polity, and will you abide by its discipline? Will you be a friend among your colleagues in ministry, working with them, subject to the ordering of God's Word and Spirit?

Will you in your own life seek to follow the Lord Jesus Christ, love your neighbors, and work for the reconciliation of the world?

Do you promise to further the peace, unity, and purity of the church?

Will you seek to serve the people with energy, intelligence, imagination, and love?

Will you be a faithful commissioned lay pastor, serving the people by proclaiming the good news, teaching faith and caring for the people, and in your ministry will you try to show the love and justice of Jesus Christ?

Ordination Prayer

Closing Declaration and Benediction

Mark, you are now a commissioned lay pastor in the Presbytery of the New Covenant serving the people of this congregation. In all you think and say and do among them, pray to be led by the Spirit of Jesus Christ and seek to serve in the strength that comes from the Spirit. Now unto Him who by the power at work within us is able to do far more abundantly than all that we ask or think; to Him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus to all generations forever and ever. Amen.
